- WHEREAS,* the region would have less traffic congestion and improved air quality if more commuters shared a ride to work; and
- WHEREAS,* sharing a ride to work would save commuters money; and
- WHEREAS,* CommuteInfo is a customer-focused full service commuting options resource center sponsored by the SPC; and
- WHEREAS,* CommuteInfo runs the region's vanpool and carpool programs, facilitating the forum for coordinating regional ridesharing efforts; and
- WHEREAS,* CommuteInfo provides information about the region's park-n-ride facilities through the Program website [www.commuteinfo.org](http://www.commuteinfo.org) or by calling toll free 1-888-819-6110; and
- WHEREAS,* several events are scheduled in May that independently promote alternatives to driving alone including National Transportation Week, National Bike Month, Bike Week and Bike to Work Day, National Employee Health and Fitness Day, and National Clean Air Week; and
- WHEREAS,* to emphasize the value of ridesharing to the region and to promote increased awareness of their program and its services, CommuteInfo has joined these efforts to promote alternatives to driving alone.

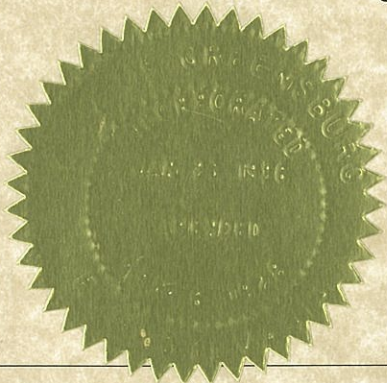
