Not long before the COVID-19 pandemic swept in, an effort was getting underway across Pennsylvania to revive a Unified Incident Command (UIC) training program that had gone quiet for many years. How many years you ask? Well, when UIC training was in its prime you could get gas for about \$3.00 per gallon, a movie was about \$6.00, the Pittsburgh Steelers were Super Bowl XL champs, and Pluto was uncermoniously stripped of "planet" status. Fast forward to 2020, and consider the irony of retooling a training program that relies on face-to-face encounters while a global pandemic was sending everone into isolation. But, knowing that emergency responses don't pause for pandemics, the dedicated team working on a new, more streamlined

UIC program soldiered on. The goal was (and still is!) to get responders with different missions and objectives at traffic incidents to communicate, collaborate, and coordinate to clear incidents faster, reduce secondary crashes, and **keep themselves safe!**

The UIC team is now on the road throughout Pennsylvania presenting the new training program content and collecting valuable feedback to develop a final version of the course. On May 24th, this road show made a stop in North Strabane Township and in the friendly confines of a sleek new firehouse presented the updated UIC concepts to a large and eager crowd of multi-disciplinary first responders. That presentation was followed by tabletop exercises to further the discussion.



These regional meetings will continue throughout the balance

of 2022, so stay tuned for more information on this course and start thinking about how you can incorporate it into *your* agency's training program!

With a recent return to in-person training (Aspinwall, West Mifflin, North Strabane Township, e.g.), we are putting a bunch of heads together to coordinate added TIM responder safety classes, and perhaps a train the trainer session as well for those who want to teach others. Conceptually, the Southwestern PA Commission region could be host to one training per month. The PA Turnpike Commission is another provider, and those sessions can be opened to more than just turnpike personnel and contractors. These classes would rotate through different locations each month, and would also accommodate virtual sessions as well.

SPC would be looking to touch the PennDOT District 10 counties (Butler, Armstrong, Indiana) each quarter, and the southern PennDOT District 12 area (Westmoreland, Greene, Washington, Fayette counties) each quarter. Locations will be as available, but be chosen based as much as possible on making the sites reachable from other areas. District 11 includes Allegheny, Beaver, Lawrence counties, and the Tunnels. Day and night meetings would be held whenever possible, and it is possible there could be different locations for daylight and evening on the same day. Trainers will be offered opportunities to teach modules or an entire class.

• Health: Local health and medical-related programs.

•Veteran and Military Support: Programs that provide support and services to veterans, active members of the military and their families.

Applicants must have tax-exempt status under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and must be physically located in the city, town or region where Penn National Gaming has a business interest.
