

About the Plan

The 2025 Active Transportation Plan (ATP) is an update to the Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission's (SPC)'s 2019 ATP and was undertaken to address evolving trends and priorities related to active transportation and provide best practices for local governments seeking to advance local goals for active transportation.

The 2025 ATP is presented as an interactive web application, which offers a collection of web-based tools and resources, featuring findings from multimodal network analyses and interactive maps to help local governments locate gaps in the network and areas for improvement to encourage more walking and rolling trips, which will help advance the regional vision of "connected mobility" for all.

Plan Goals and Implementation Focus Areas

The 2025 ATP supports the Regional Vision of a world-class, safe, and well-maintained integrated transportation system that provides mobility for all, and includes four goals:

Safety

Connectivity

Comfort

Sustainability

The plan identifies four focus areas for 2025-2030 implementation actions: regional trail coordination, funding for active transportation, technical assistance for sidewalk maintenance and repairs, and model policy development.

Companion Resources

Active Transportation Profiles – Overviews of existing conditions for each county plus the City of Pittsburgh.

Community Engagement Summary – Provides an overview of the input gained through four listening sessions and an online survey.

Network Analysis Methodology – Explains the various analyses performed to evaluate the active transportation network. The results of the analyses are presented in interactive web application.

Multimodal Plans and Policies Inventory – Descriptions of key plans and policies that support active transportation, with an inventory of the status of local plans and policies.

Active Transportation Design Toolkit - Guidelines for implementing active transportation projects. It lists design resources, describes facility types and considerations, and includes more detailed guidance on key issues/needs in the region.
