4. Message from the Executive Director – Rich Fitzgerald, Executive Director

Mr. Fitzgerald stated that he wanted to start off with the data center tour in Loudon County, Virginia. Thanks also to McNees and Allegheny Conference for partnering with us. The County Officials in Loudon County were very helpful, and the tour was great success.

In May SPC will conduct a virtual Long-Range Planning Panel Meeting, and in July will be the last meeting of the Long-Range Plan. A requirement we must do every eight years by statute and good participation is very important.

SPC has a new hire, Catherine Aaron. Catherine is a Data Information Data Analyst. Julia Ferri worked for us for several years, was promoted to the Transportation Transit TDM Program Manager. She took over that position, which had been held by Anthony Hickton. Leanne Chaney also has been with us for several years. She's been promoted to Active Transportation Manager, and Jackie Pacheco, has been promoted to the Workforce and Economic Development as the International Trade Export Assistant Manager. She is replacing Rena Belshe who has retired.

Now the NFL recap. Everybody in this room should be so proud. The region came together and made the draft a huge success. Also, the fact that Pittsburgh set the record. The only place, the only city franchise that's gone over 800,000 fans, breaking the record of Detroit of a couple years ago that was like 750,000 fans. But more importantly, it seemed to go off without any issues with respect to public safety, and with respect to transportation. Our transit agencies depend on public safety, all the agencies, your transit agencies working with PRT really shined. I want to give a special shoutout to our organization and Devon White, SPC Transit Manager. All the 10-counties as well as the City of Pittsburgh. Thank you too all.

Our 2027-2030 TIP is underway. There is a survey out now and public TIP meeting will be starting soon. Please participate if you can. Also, June 1st and 2nd will be a Legislative Breakfast in Harrisburg. Please see DJ if you will be attending.

Ms. Pro stated, is it too early to capitalize on our transit that shined at the draft? A lot of people in the region who went to the draft, may have never used PRT or any other transit from outlying counties and where more willing to pay transit than driving and paying for parking.

Mr. Fitzgerald remarked that was brought up at the Regional Policy Committee meeting and how we can have greater levels of cooperation and collaboration between the transit agencies As the State moves forward with a transportation funding bill, this could be part of the discussion.

5. Transportation Update – Lillie Gabreski, Director of Transportation

Ms. Gabreski explained that she would discuss the 2027-2030 TIP at the Commission Meeting but just wanted to stated that SPC is getting ready to go into formal public comment meetings. FTA and PennDOT have reviewed our draft list of TIP projects. The Transportation Technical Committee has approved the drat TIP project list at the March meeting and advanced it to Air Quality Conformity. So, we are in good shape. At the June Commission meeting, the TIP will be presented for approval.
